REGIONAL CENTER SERVICES

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES (DDS)



The Department of Developmental Services (DDS) is a state agency in California established in 1969 through the The Lanterman Developmental Disabilities Services Act. DDS is responsible for implementing and overseeing services for individuals with developmental disabilities. DDS works through a regional centers to coordinate and provide various supports, such as vocational training, educational assistance, and behavioral services.

As a part of the DDS system, you and your family have access to a wide range of resources and opportunities tailored to meet your unique needs, including:

- **Eligibility Determination**: DDS assists individuals in determining their eligibility for various support services and programs.
- **Service Coordination**: DDS will work with you to develop personalized plans and connect them with the right providers, ensuring you receive the support and accommodations necessary for success.
- Access to Community Resources: DDS serves as a hub for connecting individuals with developmental disabilities, including Deaf Plus individuals, to community resources and services.
- Collaboration with Service Providers: DDS collaborates with various service organizations to find the right service provider that will meet your unique needs and offer tailored support.

NORTH LOS ANGELES COUNTY REGIONAL CENTER



The North Los Angeles County Regional Center (NLACRC) is a key organization dedicated to providing services and supports to individuals with developmental disabilities, including Deaf Plus individuals, in the North Los Angeles County region.

NLACRC offers the following:

- **Eligibility Determination:** NLACRC helps determine your eligibility for regional center services and support. They assess your needs and work with you and your family to develop an individualized plan.
- Individual Program Plan (IPP): NLACRC assists in developing an IPP that
 outlines the specific services and supports you require. This plan focuses
 on areas such as education, employment, independent living, and social
 and recreational activities.
- Service Coordination: NLACRC provides service coordination to ensure you
 receive the supports outlined in your IPP. They connect you with service
 providers and monitor your progress towards achieving your goals.







DOR's Deaf and Hard of Hearing services provide a wide range of vocational rehabilitation services to persons who are deaf, hard of hearing, late deafened and deaf-blind.

The Deaf and Hard of Hearing Counselors are qualified as being proficient in American Sign Language (ASL) to ensure direct communication access with consumers who use ASL as their primary mode of communication. Deaf and Hard of Hearing Counselors are located in most offices throughout the State. **You do need to be a consumer of the Department to receive services**.

Specialized services include:

- Assistive listening devices and other rehabilitation technology
- Interpreter services
- Referrals and assistance to obtain services from specialized agencies
- Specialized vocational and other training services
- Audiologic and hearing aid assessments
- ADA requirements for communication accessibility
- Resources for hard of hearing and late deafened individuals.


